2021 in Review

As summer drew near, Helena Food Share returned to near-normal operations. The Pantry reopened for **Grocery Share** shopping in June. The number of people allowed inside continues to be limited to meet social distancing guidelines. Staples are pre-



boxed so customers can shop more quickly and then select their own dairy, meat, produce, and baked goods.


Summer also saw the return of the **Farm Stand** and garden produce. From July through September, bumper crops from

around the valley were shared, filling the Farm Stand and the Pantry with fresh, nutritious food.

Customers utilizing the Senior
Commodities program decreased slightly throughout the year as seniors limited their activities due to the pandemic. We have seen customers return this fall and continue to promote the program to eligible audiences.

services grew as the year progressed. A new program at Fort Harrison for veterans as part of Montana Joining Community Forces started in May. The Mobile Pantry also serves low-income Helena residents with mobility restrictions

at six other locations throughout the community once a month.

The **Kid Pack** program continued to see a slight decrease last spring as schools adjusted to the pandemic. As regular school schedules resumed, the fall numbers have returned to about 1,000 packs each week.



Since the start of the year, the

number of **Emergency Food Packs** provided to our community partners has doubled. Offered to individuals who have not eaten in some time and urgently need high-calorie, nutritional food, these packs help them with their immediate need.
