By the Numbers: Your Support in Action

77,910 times last year, a neighbor in the Helena area was hungry and needed food.

And **77,910** times they received help, because of you.

Over the last twelve months, community members donated time, money and food to help our neighbors. Here are some things that were made possible in 2019 through our community making a commitment to erasing hunger in Helena:

43,889 Kid Packs were given to elementary and pre-school children

1,805,988 pounds of food served people in need

2,206 Senior Commodity boxes were given to our seniors in need

1,956 families enjoyed a holiday meal with a turkey.

1,085 individuals received emergency snack packs to curb their urgent need for food.

And, 4,742 volunteers helped make it all happen, by carrying groceries for a customer, stocking shelves and sorting produce, assemblying Kid Packs each week and so much more.

In 2019, our grocery store partners who participate in our Grocery Rescue program generously donated more than one million pounds of good food. It goes to people in need and reduces the amount of food waste in our community.


